

DO

- Inform the ARC Harbourmaster's Office of any change of address or vessel details
- Inform the ARC Harbourmaster's Office of any temporary user of your mooring
- Ensure your vessel is securely fixed to the mooring and not the buoy rope
- Advise the ARC Harbourmaster's Office if your vessel sustains damage whilst occupying a mooring
- Ensure the mooring buoy is correctly marked with the correct mooring number
- Contact the ARC Harbourmaster's Office if there is a vessel on your mooring that does not have authority to be there.

DON'T

- Lend your mooring without approval from ARC Harbourmaster's Office
- Sell your mooring without going through the Transfer process
- Re-site your mooring without approval from the ARC Harbourmaster's Office
- Remove any unauthorised vessel off your mooring without approval from the ARC Harbourmaster's Office.

Information



Moorings information

Mooring sites are located within Mooring Management Areas throughout the Auckland region. The ARC allocates a site and issues a Permit that is renewed on payment of the annual fee. If you wish to lay a mooring outside the Mooring Management Area a resource consent is required.

How to obtain a mooring

Contact the ARC Harbourmaster's Office with your preferred area(s) for a mooring and vessel details.

Harbourmaster staff will advise which areas and sites are available and will issue a site for your perusal. Subject to your approval, a mooring permit will be granted and arrangements made for a mooring to be laid on that site. Alternatively:

- Check the Marine Section of the NZ Herald or the Trade and Exchange for moorings
- Check notice boards at local clubs
- Check local newspapers.



Note: To ensure the mooring permit is correct, please contact the ARC Harbourmaster's Office with the mooring number or owners details. Harbourmaster staff will confirm the last inspection date and the suitability of the mooring hardware for the vessel you want to place on it.

Pile moorings

The ARC owns and administers Pile moorings situated at Te Atatu and Panmure for vessels up to 15 metres.

Due to popularity, there are waiting lists for these areas.

Waiting lists

To join the waiting list you must contact the ARC Harbourmaster's Office. In popular Swing Mooring areas waiting lists may also apply.

Transferring a mooring

A Mooring Transfer Certificate must be completed and signed by both parties and returned to the ARC Harbourmaster's Office. A \$50 transfer fee (incl GST) applies.

- A mooring site can only be transferred at the will of the ARC Harbourmaster
- A mooring transfer will only be processed if all the annual fees have been paid
- The vessel must be suitable for the mooring site and approved by the ARC Harbourmaster
- Where waiting lists apply, moorings sites can ONLY be transferred to the next suitable person on the waiting list.

Sub-leasing a mooring

A mooring site can only be sub leased for a period no greater than six months and with the permission of the ARC Harbourmaster.

This request must be forwarded to the ARC Harbourmaster's Office in writing with the temporary user's vessel and contact details.

Responsibilities as a mooring holder

- Payment of mooring annual rental fees
- The mooring site must be marked with a buoy or float approved by the ARC Harbourmaster clearly displaying the mooring number as allocated by the Harbourmaster
- The mooring must be maintained in a safe and efficient condition
- Moorings must be inspected by an approved contractor at least once every three years. It is the mooring owner's responsibility to arrange this inspection and a copy of the inspection certificate must be forwarded to the ARC Harbourmaster's Office

Note: In some exposed areas the ARC Harbourmaster recommends that mooring inspections be carried out every 18 months to two years

- If you wish to sell your mooring, it is the mooring permit holder's responsibility to ensure the transfer certificate is completed and returned to the ARC Harbourmaster's Office
- You must have the ARC Harbourmaster's approval to sub lease your mooring
- If you wish to cancel your mooring permit you must do so in writing to the ARC Harbourmaster's Office
- If you wish to change the vessel on your mooring, you must have approval from the ARC Harbourmaster.
