**Rationale**

- State of the environment reports produced by the Hauraki Gulf Forum have identified the need for greater resourcing and capacity for the identification and management of sites of historic significance.
- Recent guidance produced by the forum on the Hauraki Gulf Marine Park Act identifies the requirements for RMA policies and plans to recognise and reflect tangata whenua relationships with the Gulf.
- This capacity building seminar will facilitate discussion about the use and development of tools such as effects based planning, predictive modelling and cultural heritage inventories.
- It will enable the articulation of perspectives and knowledge of tangata whenua advocates around the Gulf.
