

Limited mobility access to Scandrett Regional Park

Tracks are currently under-developed and none are accessible, apart from the route to the baches along the Scandrett Bay beach front, past the homestead and farm buildings. The park is very undulating, steep in parts, with several gates.

Graham bach is accessible to many wheelchair users.

Areas audited

1. Car park
2. Toilets
3. Pedestrian route to the homestead and farm buildings
4. Graham Bach

Car park

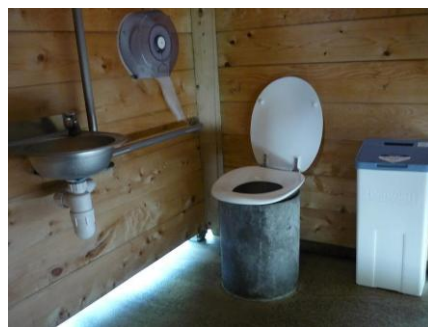
Gobi pavers comprise the surface of the car park, the gaps of which are filled with gravel and grass, so moving over them with a wheelchair or walking equipment is reasonably easy.

Parking spaces are defined in the design, but no space is designated for mobility parking.



Toilets

Accessible male and female toilets are provided. The facility is approached by both ramp and steps. Pan heights are 480mm with good supportive seats and lids. The single cold water tap is a push-down water saver model.



Pedestrian route to the farm buildings and baches

The route from the car park past the homestead to the farm buildings is grass and steep at the lower end. The route is particularly difficult if the grass is wet. Once at the lower level, the route via the vehicle track is accessible to the baches at the far end of the beach.
